Graduation Requirements

To receive a high school diploma from South Haven High School, a student must earn 22 credits. A credit is equal to one year's work for classes meeting every day. Credit may also be earned for successful completion of a competency test(s) as allowed by state law or virtual education. Students must complete all sections of the SAT/Michigan Merit Exam required by the Michigan Department of Education in their junior (11th grade) year.
